Thank you for your interest in volunteering at the Dorothy H. O'Connor Pet Adoption Center (DOCPAC). The time and attention that our volunteers spend with animals helps to keep the animals well-socialized and better able to present themselves when people come looking for a pet to adopt. This, in turn, helps animals find good homes. You will need to attend our Volunteer Orientation which will be a basic training session on safe animal handling procedures before you begin your volunteer hours. If you are under the age of 16, you must be accompanied by an adult at all times during your volunteer hours. The adult(s) must take the Volunteer Orientation training that will be accompanying the child. A strict ratio of one adult to every two minors will be enforced. Volunteers must be at least 10 years of age. There will be no exceptions to this rule.

Volunteer Orientation is held at DOCPAC one Saturday per month from 9:30am-11:00am. Dates are subject to change. Seating is limited. Please wear appropriate, comfortable clothing and tennis shoes. NO FLIP FLOPS.

To register for Volunteer Orientation, the following must be complete.

- 1. Completed Volunteer Application
- 2. We charge a one-time administrative fee of \$25.00 to help us cover the cost of our volunteer program, which includes one t-shirt and orientation materials. Fees are non-refundable. If you are supervising a child, the fee is waived and a t-shirt can be purchased separately.
- 3. The parent/guardian accompanying the child volunteering must take the Volunteer Orientation class. Following Completion of training, you are welcome to visit the shelter to volunteer during our *Volunteer hours Monday thru Saturday 12:00pm-5:00pm*. Volunteers work under the guidance of the Shelter Manager, or the senior staff member on duty. A member of the shelter staff will always be available to assist you should a question or concern arise. **Volunteer Orientation is required.**

Frequently Asked Questions:

Can I bring home diseases or infections to my pets?

We encourage all volunteers to keep their own pets up to date on vaccination. Using common sense "infection control," such as washing your hands thoroughly with antibacterial soap and water, or using hand sanitizer, at the Shelter after handling each animal and before you go home, will help protect you and the animals. Wearing old clothes and removing them on your return home gives an added protection.

Will I get bitten or scratched?

There is always the chance, when working with animals, that a scratch or bite may occur. Following our routine procedures for safe handling of animals will help to minimize this possibility. We strongly suggest that you only work with animals you feel completely comfortable with.

Must I commit to a minimum number of monthly hours to be eligible to volunteer at the Shelter?

No – We encourage you to work us in your schedule.
